

The 2021–2022 school year continues to be affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, presenting parents, students and educators with a number of challenges. We invite you to explore the various formats of our program offerings and to discuss whatever your unique learning objectives may be.

What to Look Forward to this School Year

The McMichael will continue to monitor the directives of public-health authorities closely. We will continue working with our partners at the school boards and adjust our programming as needed, to keep students and educators safe. In this time of restrictions and social distancing due to COVID-19, a personal and creative connection to art and nature has become even more important for health and wellbeing. This school year, help your students reignite a spark of creativity and imagination with the art of Canada.

The powerful combination of a world-class art gallery and spectacular grounds overlooking the historical Carrying Place Trail, makes the McMichael an attractive destination for school field trips. Marked by successive lockdowns, the previous school year proved that the Gallery's educational programs can be successfully delivered through virtual synchronous learning, thanks to an exceptionally versatile team of educators and new communication technology. We hope that the upcoming year will allow a return to in-person visits to the McMichael, and we remain ready to work with teachers, educators and parents to support the learning and mental-health needs of students.

To make the experience worry free, we continue to offer a variety of delivery options that are flexible in the event of changes to public-health guidelines.



All McMichael educational programs are based on the Gallery's permanent and special exhibitions. This year, the McMichael will feature a remarkable lineup of shows focusing on diversity and inclusion within Canadian society. Beginning with Denyse Thomasos: Odyssey, the first serious critical survey of the late Trinidadian-Canadian artist, the exhibition


program will continue with Uninvited: Canadian Women Artists in the Modern Moment, which re-examines the situation of women artists in the 1920s and 1930s in Canada, and a special mural project by Bonnie Devine, an Anishinaabe/Ojibwa artist, entitled From Water to Water, which creatively revisits the history of the Humber Valley and the Carrying Place Trail.



Together with the continuation of "A Like Vision": The Group of Seven at 100, this exhibition program will offer an opportunity for constructive conversations about social and political barriers experienced in Canada by marginalized groups and communities in the past and present.

We also invite your classes to continue these meaningful conversations through our outdoor programming. Revolving around the beautiful Minokamik Garden, newly named by Education Advisor Elder Shelley Charles, these programs integrate Indigenous traditional knowledge with the artmaking experiences of various Canadian artists to inspire students to reconnect with nature and take an active stand in environmental advocacy.

In a time of serious reconsideration of Canada as a progressive and inclusive country, the McMichael offers your students a unique learning experience that inspires reflection, insight and action.

The McMichael's educational programming is based on student-centred dialogue that advances visual literacy, deepens critical and creative thinking, and invites students to bring their own perspective to the art objects they encounter. All conversations and artmaking workshops are designed to develop attitudes, values and skills that nurture growth and well-being and to promote inclusive and active community engagement.

The McMichael's proposed learning experiences can be applied across the curriculum and address the Ministry of Education's expectations for each grade level.

BOOKING INFORMATION

The McMichael offers many unique educational experiences to choose from! Select from a range of on-site programs, including Gallery and Outdoor Tours, as well as Art-in-Action Workshops. Invite a McMichael Educator into the classroom with Art2Go, or virtually through our McMichael Virtual Classroom, which offers virtual guided art viewing and studio programs.

All virtual programs are available Monday to Friday from 9 am to 4 pm.

On-site and Art2Go programs are available weekdays from 10 am to 4 pm, September through June.

All programs begin at the top of the hour.

Virtual and on-site programs may also be booked on weekends, subject to availability.

When you book, please be prepared to provide the following information:

- The program(s) you are interested in booking
- The grade level(s) and total number of students who will participate
- Your preferred dates
- Your anticipated arrival and departure times if booking an on-site program
- Your preferred virtual platform if booking a virtual program

We encourage you to start the booking process online using the Online Inquiry form. Once you have completed it, our staff will follow up within two business days.

Please book as early as possible to secure your spot and communicate any special programming requests at the time of booking.

THE McMICHAEL'S COVID-19-RELATED POLICIES

PROGRAM DELIVERY LOGISTICS

VIRTUAL CLASSROOM PROGRAMS

The McMichael recommends the use of the Zoom video conferencing platform for our virtual programs. Each program runs on our professional level Zoom account, and educators will be provided with a private link to access their chosen content. If your school board prefers a different platform, please be sure to make note of it during the booking process. Our Creative Learning department would be pleased to adapt the program to your platform of choice.

Teachers will be responsible for the management of their students and are required to be present for the duration of the program

ON-SITE PROGRAMS

The minimum booking requirement for on-site programs is two hours and the minimum groups size is 10 students.

Upon arrival, visiting classes will be divided into groups of no more than 10 students. Due to restrictions on the number of participants in accordance with publichealth guidelines, a limited number of chaperones are permitted during on-site programs. Each group will be allowed a specific number of chaperones, according to the following guidelines:

JK TO GRADE 3:

One adult supervisor per five students. (1:5)

GRADES 4 TO 12:

One adult supervisor per 10 students. (1:10)



The required number of adult supervisors will receive complimentary admission.

Teachers and adult supervisors are required to stay with their groups for the duration of their booking, including during the optional lunch period.

During on-site visits, school groups are not permitted to visit the gallery spaces unless accompanied by a McMichael staff member. Staff are unable to supervise groups beyond the length of the booked program(s).

Outdoor programs will take place if weather permits. We kindly request that teachers and parents/guardians ensure that students are dressed appropriately for the conditions. In the event of inclement weather, the program will take place indoors.

ART2GO IN-SCHOOL PROGRAMS

The minimum group size for an Art2Go in-school program is 20 students.

Teachers are required to stay with the group for the duration of the program and assist the McMichael educator upon arrival at the school. When an Art2Go program is booked, a requirements form will be provided electronically.

LUNCH

A 30-minute lunch break can be requested when booking on-site programming. Please mention this request during the booking process, as space is limited and availability is dependent on public-health guidelines.

Please note that the McMichael does not provide food service to school groups.

While we are not currently offering the I ♥ McMichael Mini Tour on-site, we encourage teachers to share a virtual version of this tour prior to any booked programs. The video, which introduces students to the history of the McMichael Canadian Art Collection, will be provided via a link by email upon booking.

PROGRAM FEES

Pricing of all school programs, virtual and on-site, are based on a rate of \$6 per hour of programming per student. Please refer to individual programs for specific costs.

Pricing of all Art2Go programs is \$12 per student.

PAYMENT

A deposit of 50% of the total contracted fee is due at the time of booking. The balance is due upon program delivery. The McMichael accepts VISA, MasterCard, American Express, cash, debit or cheques (payable to McMichael Canadian Art Collection). Groups booking programs with fewer than the minimum number of students will be charged for the minimum amount.

CANCELLATIONS AND PROGRAM MODIFICATIONS

Any cancellations or program modifications must be received in writing 30 days prior to the scheduled programming. Cancellations made within 30 days of the scheduled programming will be charged 50% of the contracted rate. Rescheduling within 30 days of your scheduled programming will result in a 10% administration fee, calculated on the total cost of the booking.

Any change in the number of participating students must be received in writing 30 days prior to the scheduled programming. Changes made within 30 days of the scheduled programming can be altered by up to 10% of the original number booked. For example: if you have booked for 50 students, but only 25 students attend, you will be charged for 45 students (50 students, less 10%).

VIRTUAL PROGRAMS 1-HOUR

Fee: \$6 per student

These virtual programs, led by a McMichael Educator, guide students through the process of looking at, analyzing and interpreting artworks featured in the Gallery's permanent collection. Each virtual engagement includes interactive activities that encourage students to practice critical thinking, while gaining an understanding of different styles of art and how they are created. The McMichael recommends the use of the Zoom video conferencing platform for our virtual programs. NEW! THROUGH THE WINDOW GRADES JK - 3

Young learners will love exploring the view from an artist's window through a variety of artworks in the McMichael collection. While interactive activities promote investigation into the elements of design, such as colour, line and shape, collaborative storytelling will engage students' literacy skills. A final artmaking activity will encourage students' creative response and expression.

GRADES 4 - 8

Explore some of the Group of Seven's iconic works from the McMichael's collection during this guided viewing program. Group activities encourage students to learn to identify the elements and principles of art, while discovering the personal style of each member of the Group of Seven.

STYLE EXPLORATIONS: NORVAL MORRISSEAU AND OTHER ANISHINAABE ARTISTS

GRADES 1 - 3, 4 - 8

Students will engage in activities to discover how Morrisseau employs the elements and principles of design and how his distinct style has influenced other artists, such as Carl Ray and Blake Debassige.




NOW VIRTUAL! STORIES OF OUR LAND



STORIES FROM CANADA

GRADES 7 - 8, 9 - 12

Using the McMichael's rich and diverse art holdings, students will explore art as an expression of personal experience and examine various cultural narratives of the past and present. Artworks exploring the legacy of colonialism in Canada, such as the residential school system, slavery and industrialization will be among the topics discussed. Stories of resiliency, honouring pride, identity and connection will encourage students to examine their own experiences, personal gifts and community, contributing to a newfound sense of belonging and reconciliation.

INDIGENOUS ART AT THE MCMICHAEL

GRADES 9 - 12

This virtual overview of Indigenous art at the McMichael, including iconic works from past and current exhibitions, will highlight the cultural and stylistic diversity of Indigenous artists, while addressing the common challenges experienced by their communities, such as Canadian policies of cultural assimilation, the residential school system and forced displacement. The discussion around the artworks presented, ranging from historical to contemporary, will allow students to gain a deeper understanding of the cultural resilience of Indigenous communities in the face of these challenges, as well as the power of art to advocate for civil and environmental rights.

DISCOVERING THE GROUP OF SEVEN: 100 YEARS LATER

GRADES 9 - 12

This interactive virtual experience offers students an opportunity to discover "A Like Vision": The Group of Seven at 100, an exhibition that celebrates the 100th anniversary of the Group of Seven's first exhibition. Combining exhibition installation shots with a viewing of some of the most iconic artworks from the Gallery's permanent collection, this tour will investigate the individual artistic styles of the Group's members, explore the historical and political situation of their time, and reassess the Group's legacy within contemporary Canada.

VIRTUAL STUDIOS: 2-HOUR WORKSHOPS

Fee: \$12 per student

Conducted live by a McMichael instructor. these process-oriented studios include an exploration of techniques as students learn tips and tricks for creating their own unique pieces of art. These presentations include detailed looking, pre-recorded videos, as well as live instruction, culminating in a collective art critique. Please note that the McMichael does not provide artmaking materials for the following virtual studios.

Basic materials will be suggested to help accommodate what participants have on hand in the classroom.



PAINTING WITH THE GROUP OF SEVEN, LANDSCAPE STUDIO

GRADES 4 - 12

Inspired by the artwork of the Group of Seven, this studio instructs students on how to go from a series of initial sketches to a completed piece of art, all while exploring the Group's modernist take on the landscape genre and comparing it with other approaches. Exploration of location and space will be an important part of this process-oriented studio, as students focus on perspective, focal point and working with a nature-inspired colour palette.

STORYTELLERS & IMAGE-MAKERS ARTMAKING STUDIO

GRADES 4 - 8

Rooted in the visual language of the Anishinaabe School of Painting, this studio focuses on the rich tradition of Indigenous storytelling, highlighting the connection between the natural and spiritual world. Developed in collaboration with Don Chrétien, an Ojibwe artist, designer and educator, this studio demonstrates how strongly Norval Morrisseau's legacy continues to resonate within the contemporary world.

NOW VIRTUAL! MAPPING LANDSCAPES **WATERCOLOUR STUDIO**

GRADES 4 - 8

Developed in close collaboration with John Hartman—an Ontario-based artist celebrated for his unique lavered landscape paintings—this virtual watercolour studio invites students to investigate the notion of a cultural landscape and to create their own personal response to the land, while investigating its geography and history.



KINDERGARTEN 2 HOURS

Fee: \$12 per student

COLOUR QUEST

KINDERGARTEN

Specifically designed for young learners and focusing on the elements of design, this program offers play-based gallery activities, including role-playing and storytelling, to introduce students to iconic Canadian artworks. The Gallery visit is followed by a workshop, in which students experiment with artmaking techniques. A short break will be provided.

ABC — ART BASIC CONCEPTS


GRADES JK - 3

Students will explore a variety of artworks in the Gallery and develop a greater appreciation for the composition of visual forms by focusing on the elements of design, such as colour, shape and line. Discussion will take place around an artist's personal style, choice of subject matter and individual interpretive response to the work.

A great overview of the McMichael's collection and various genres of art. The program includes an art-focused discourse, based on personal response, interpretation and ideas about the impact that artworks can have on individuals and communities at large.

GRADES 7 – 8, 9 – 12

Engage with the McMichael's natural setting in a one-of-a-kind outdoor learning experience. View historic landmarks, such as the Humber River; breathtaking greenspace, including the Sculpture Garden; and a culturally diverse collection of art. Students will discover the human impact on a changing landscape by exploring the grounds surrounding the McMichael.

1-HOUR WORKSHOPS

Fee: \$6 per student

ART DETECTIVES

GRADES 1-3

In this workshop, students will engage in hands-on art activities to better understand the role of design within the composition of an artwork. The final drawing activity will allow students to use this knowledge in the creation of a personalized postcard. Teachers can choose an artistic movement or a specific artist on which they would like their students to focus.

COLOUR CONCEPTS

GRADES 4 - 6

Students will investigate the colour connections between artworks currently on view. They will build an understanding of colour relationships, such as complimentary, monochromatic and analogous, with an emphasis on the use of colour for expressive purposes. Set within the Gallery, this drawing workshop includes a 40-minute artmaking activity inspired by colour theory.

CROSSING-THE-LINE SKETCHING WORKSHOP

GRADES 7 - 8, 9 - 12

Students will explore works of art from the McMichael's collection, along with the function of drawing within various art processes and drawing techniques. This program will offer a 40-minute drawing workshop, including an introduction to basic drawing techniques and a final critique.

ART AND POETRY SLAM

GRADES 7 - 8, 9 - 12

The idea of artistic inspiration and the connection between words and images are examined. Drawing on the works of poets and writers whose work is featured in the McMichael's collection, including J.E.H. MacDonald and Emily Carr, students will create their own haiku poem inspired by an artwork.

2-HOUR WORKSHOPS

EN PLEIN AIR ADVENTURE*

GRADES 1 - 3, 4 - 8, 9 - 12

Students will experience and discuss what it means to create an artwork en plein air, beginning with close observation of landscape paintings by members of the Group of Seven and their contemporaries from the McMichael's collection.

Students will then take advantage of the surrounding outdoor environment to gain a greater sense of the challenges artists encounter while working outdoors. A 40-minute outdoor workshop will follow a discussion about vantage point, landscape composition and the relationship between

GRADES 4 - 8, 9 - 12

Students will discover original paintings by Tom Thomson, followed by a visit to see the Tom Thomson Shack, located on the McMichael's grounds. This workshop is the perfect mix of discovery, artmaking and storytelling. Students will hear stories about the artist's legacy and the Thomson Shack before participating in a 50-minute Thomson-inspired outdoor artmaking workshop.

LEARNING FROM THE LAND*


GRADES 6 - 8

Developed in collaboration with Philip Cote, Young Elder and Anishinabek Traditional Teacher, this outdoor program explores the human footprint on the environment through the lenses of both traditional Indigenous knowledge and scientific inquiry. The program is centred around Indigenous plants and their medicinal and nutritional properties, as well as discussions about the importance of environmental responsibility. The program culminates in a field-sketching art activity.



It will lead students from an initial compositional study to a final painting. Exploration of both colour gradation and space will be an important part of this process-oriented studio, as students learn tips and tricks for painting perspective, identifying a focal point and working with a palette inspired by nature.

HAIDA MANGA STUDIO

GRADES 1 – 12

Developed in collaboration with artist Michael Nicoll Yahgulanaas, author of the award-winning books RED: A Haida Manga and Flight of the Hummingbird: A Parable of the Environment, this studio covers the narrative and aesthetic function of the traditional Northwest Coast form line in combination with popular manga cartooning techniques.

#LandIsSacred, #WaterIsLife PRINTMAKING STUDIO

GRADES 9 – 12

This thought-provoking studio was developed in collaboration with Métis artist Christi Belcourt. The importance of land and water is a recurring theme throughout Belcourt's work and will be emphasized in this studio through discussion and creative response.

Students are invited to contemplate the notion of environmental stewardship, culminating in a creative project that uses innovative printmaking techniques and natural inks. The workshop comes full circle, with students producing a final piece of art that they can choose to offer back to Mother Earth.

MAPPING LANDSCAPES WATERCOLOUR STUDIO

GRADES 9 – 12

Developed in close collaboration with John Hartman—an Ontario-based artist celebrated for his unique layered landscape paintings—this watercolour studio invites students to investigate the notion of a cultural landscape and to create their own personal response to the land, while investigating its geography and history.
